

REPORT ON SWING BINS

Entrance to BRM: One each on the North Eastern, North Western and South Western side where the vegetable sellers ply their goods and where labourers gather in the mornings for contractors to pick them up.

It is also in the afternoons the exit for residents of Marsele and Klipfontein and other workers who wait for lifts. (3)

Corner of Main and Marais Streets: The triangular erf on the corner of the two streets is a popular gathering place for contract workers during lunch time. (1)

Logout-Gas.comm: This is a visiting place with seats in the open air. There is also now food being sold on the premises. (1)

Tennis Courts: This area is heavily visited during holiday periods by young people and children. One swing bin on each side of the building should be erected. (2)

Walker Park: We have made the park more user friendly and one bin in the centre thereof should be sufficient. (1)

Parking area (River Bank): One additional swing bin at the end of the parking area in the direction of the bridge. (1)

River swimming area: At the southern side of the toilet block, one additional swing bin should be placed and a further one on the northern side of the Skinderboom. (2)

"Look Out" (across the house of Charles Sprong): One swing bin in the middle of the look out area. (1)

Picnic Area: A total of three are needed. One on the left hand side of the first picnic place and a second at the light pole at the second picnic area and a third one where the picnic area ends. (3)

River Bank: To provide for the rubbish left by fishermen we suggest that at least two swing bins are necessary. It can also be used as bins when the river bank is being cleaned. One is needed at the river by the zigzag and a second near the bridge. (2)

In the circumstances a total of 17 swing bins are consequently required.

The 17 swing bins are the minimum required in order to provide for litter in the area. We refer to Section 19 and 19A of the Environment Conservation Act No 73 of 1989.

"19 *Prohibition of Littering.* –

(1) *No person shall discard, dump or leave any litter on any land or water surface, street, road or site or on any place to which the public has access, accept in a container or at a place which has been specially indicated, provided or set apart for such purpose.*

(2) *Every person or authority in control of or responsible for the maintenance of any place to which the public has access shall at all times ensure that containers or places are provided which will normally be adequate and suitable for the discarding of litter by the public.*

19A *Removal of Litter. – Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 19(2), every person or authority in control of or responsible for the maintenance of any place to which the public has access, shall within a reasonable time after any litter has been discarded, dumped or left behind at such place (with the inclusion of any pavement adjacent to, or land situated between, such a place and the street, road or site used by the public to get access to such place) remove such litter or cause it to be removed."*
